# Letter from Leadership



2022 was a challenging year coming out of the pandemic and moving into an economic crisis which impacted our community and challenged our ability to keep up with the demand for food. With the cost of groceries increasing, we saw the number of new guests increase to over 100/month in 2022. The cost of providing basics – fresh produce, meat, bread, eggs, milk, and butter – increased our monetary outlay on purchased food.

Thanks to the generosity of our local community, Dunedin Cares Food Pantry distributed 382,500 pounds food to 8,086 households, which represents over 20,000 individuals. We are appreciative of our local churches, civic groups, businesses, and private individuals that supported us through monetary and food donations each month. Additionally, our volunteers, the heart of our organization, put in 10,350 hours to support our operations.

There were multiple milestones that we experienced that support our mission: hiring of JoAnne Fell as our first paid Executive Director, becoming a member of Feeding Tampa Bay, expanding our ability to apply for grant assistance and holding our first fundraiser, the Bootlegger's Ball.

The continued increase in demand has stressed our ability to house perishable and non-perishable goods as well as accommodating the needs of our guests. Our Board of Directors is actively exploring the expansion of our pantry into a new, more functional space. We hope to solidify these plans in 2023 and be in a new footprint in 2024.

We are inspired by the kind, caring and generous individuals who support us year-round and help us meet the needs of our local community. Your generosity makes a difference!
